Dear Optimist,

This packet is regarding the upcoming Ohio Optimist District, October 2012, College Club Conference. If you are not familiar with the idea of the College Club Conference, the idea came to me and other members of the Buckeye Optimist Club last year when we determined that a lot of the District events are not always applicable to college clubs. We are just fundamentally different from normal adult clubs in Optimist International and as a result, college member attendance of these events was lacking.

I have long held that one of the greatest appeals of Optimist International for college students is that it is an international organization. There is more to our clubs than what our members and communities see on campus and that fact is a huge asset to us in our pursuit of membership and growing in community service. The College Club Conference was created to ensure that the value added by this aspect of Optimist International was not lost to college students.

- 1. Fill out the below form and submit one for your entire club. Please make sure all information is complete, especially pertaining to allergies or food preferences.
- 2. Please mail all registration materials addressed to me (Peter Von Der Vellen) at: 160 E. Lane Ave, Columbus, Ohio 43201 with all complete information and payment. Checks can be made payable to Buckeye Optimist Club. If you would prefer to fill out the document and scan it you can send it to me via email. Should you chose this route you will have to pay at the Friday night check in.
- 3. The cost of attending the conference is \$10.00 per person. We have worked hard to keep this cost low for you and hope that it will not impede anyone from attending. Sadly we cannot offer a reduced cost for single day attendees but we do still ask that you let us know for what days your members will be attending so we can plan accordingly.
- 4. Included in the cost of attendance is dinner on Friday and lunch on Saturday. It is very important that you include any allergies or special requests so we can accommodate you that weekend.
- 5. We will in Schoenbaum Hall, part of the Fisher College of Business which is on north campus. The address is 210 W Woodruff Ave, Columbus, OH 43210. If you need to park in a parking garage the nearest to the conference is the lane avenue parking garage, located at 2105 Neil Avenue. Parking is not included in the conference costs.

BREAKOUT SESSIONS

This year the Conference will offer breakout sessions instead of just the roundtables of the previous year. This will give members an opportunity to learn more about what they want to and spend more time on the discussions they have. There will be two, equal length sessions in the breakout time period and the following lists what is on the agenda for each:

First Session:

- Optimist International for Presidents, Secretaries and Treasurers: This session is designed for those who wish to take a leadership role in their club which requires information on how Optimist International works. Governor Joe Madden will explain what is required of these officers and the timetable to take care of all of their responsibilities.
- 2. **The A,B,Cs of Leadership:** In any organization or situation there are some people who make things happen, some people who watch things happen and some people who wonder what's happening. This game interactively illustrates that point for participants and challenges them to figure things out for themselves. Challenging them to "lead, follow or get out of the way" as they learn how to constructively take the initiative to:
